Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul(CI) Psalter Week 1

## THE ANNOUNCER!

On this Sunday, we honour two great apostles: Saint Peter and Saint Paul. They are the twin pillars of the Church. But what an unlikely pair they were. Peter was a fisherman, impulsive, often afraid, and the one who denied Jesus three times. Paul was a scholar, zealous, intellectual, and once a fierce persecutor of Christians, even approving the stoning of Saint Stephen. With their different backgrounds, these two men laid a solid foundation for the Church.

In the first reading, Peter is in prison, bound with chains, and awaiting execution. Herod had already killed James, and it seemed the flame of the early Church was flickering. But then, light pierces the darkness. An angel awakens Peter, his chains fall, and he walks past the guards as if in a dream. God is not done with him. The mission continues.

In the second reading, Saint Paul is at the end of his journey. He is not writing from triumph but from prison, knowing that death is near. Yet his tone is not despair; it is victory. "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith." Paul ran his race with purpose. He poured out his life for the Gospel.

In the Gospel, Jesus asks a critical question: "Who do you say that I am?" Peter answers, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." And everything changes. Jesus gives him a new name, changing it from Simon to *Peter*, the Rock, with a new mission to build the Church. But let us remember this rock had cracks. Peter would still stumble, still deny, still fall. Yet Jesus never gave up on him. Christ built His Church not on perfection but on conversion, not on flawless saints, but on forgiven sinners.

Peter and Paul both endured storms. They were imprisoned, persecuted, and martyred. And yet, they never let the flame of faith go out. They gave everything for the One who gave His life for them. As we honour these twin apostles, let us ask for their intercession for the Church and each one of us. May we be inspired by Peter's perseverance, Paul's courage, and their shared zeal to make Christ known. Today, we, too, can become living stones in the Church they helped to build.
