15th June 2025 Trinity Sunday (C I) Psalter Week 3 THE ANNOUNCER!

This Sunday, we celebrate the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity—one God in three Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The Trinity is the very identity of God, revealed to us through Scripture and experienced in our lives. The Trinity shows us who God is—a communion of love—and how God chooses to be with us.

In the First Reading, the Book of Proverbs speaks of Wisdom, portrayed as being with God from the beginning, a master workman at God's side, rejoicing in His presence and delighting in humanity. This image points to Christ, the eternal Son, through whom all things were made. It reminds us that God has never been alone. From the very beginning, God is a relationship: Father, Son, and Spirit—a perfect unity of love and joy.

In the Second Reading, St. Paul gives us a practical glimpse of how the Trinity touches our daily lives: "We have peace with God the Father through our Lord Jesus Christ... and God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit." Through Jesus, we are reconciled to the Father. Through the Holy Spirit, we feel God's love—within our hearts in moments of grace, peace, and hope. Whenever you've found unexpected strength in suffering, peace amid chaos, or forgiveness that came from beyond yourself—that's the Spirit of God working in you, drawing you into the life of the Trinity. We can make the Trinitarian mystery a lived experience.

In the Gospel, Jesus prepares His disciples for His departure by promising the Holy Spirit. He explains that everything the Father has belongs to Him, and the Spirit will take what is His and make it known to us. Here, Jesus reveals to us the indivisible harmony within the Trinity: each Person united, working together, sharing fully, and continually drawing us deeper into the truth and love of God.

As we reflect on this divine mystery, we are challenged: How can we speak about the Trinity in a world that increasingly denies God's existence? How do we witness to the unity of the Trinity in a time so marked by division? How can we build community when some prefer to walk the journey of faith alone? How can we reveal the love and presence of the Trinity to families who are struggling with disunity or brokenness?

The answer may begin with a simple question: Do we want to reflect God in our Fr. Peter daily lives?
